President’s Message

Happy September, Rotarians!

The month of September on the Rotary calendar is designated as “Basic Education and Literacy Month”. As the new school year is off to a fresh start this is a very relevant theme and a good time to remind ourselves how important basic education and literacy is to our society.

While browsing the Rotary Foundation website I was surprised to see the statistic that more than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate, which is about 17 percent of the world’s adult population. What are Rotarians doing about this? Some examples include: in Afghanistan, Rotary members opened a girls’ school to break the cycle of poverty and social imbalance; in Lebanon, Rotarians are providing clean, fresh water to every public school so students can be healthier and get a better education; and in the U.S., Rotary members partnered with ProLiteracy Detroit to recruit and train tutors after a study showed that more than half of the local adult population was functionally illiterate.

Again, as you read this Rotator message, take moment to think about what our local club can do to support basic education and literacy. Is there a service project that our club could start or participant in? On a related note, I wanted to sincerely thank all our members for the very warm welcome you gave our new Salina teachers during their visit last month! Supporting our teachers and making them feel welcome in their new community is important, and the more we can do, the better.
