CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM

Rotary is a global network of business and professional leaders who serve their communities and the world. Rotary's motto, ***Service Above Self***, exemplifies the humanitarian spirit of the organization's more than 1.2 million members. Meaningful community and international service projects coupled with strong fellowship opportunities characterize Rotary worldwide.

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster

- the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise;
- high ethical standards in business and professions; and
- the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons.

What is a Corporate Membership?

The intent of this category is to attract a qualified and diverse professional base within Salina. A Corporate Membership Program will allow an organization/business to become a member of the Salina Rotary Club through the established membership approval process. This category allows for flexibility and recognizes the mobility that is the norm within the current corporate environment.

Corporate Members will be able to appoint one primary member and up to two designee members to attend club meetings, vote on club matters, and serve as club officers and on club committees.

Why Become a Corporate Member?

Being a Corporate Member of the Salina Rotary Club presents a number of advantages that include

- participation in a well-established international service organization that works to assess and respond to a diverse range of needs within our community and beyond;
- increased awareness within the community through association with Rotary and the involvement of executives and senior leadership in Rotary; and
- membership in an organization dedicated to assisting and supporting community needs and activities.

How Do Corporate Memberships Work?

There will be standard quarterly dues including the meal plan (to be determined by the Salina Rotary Club Board of Directors). Should members leave the organization/business for any reason, membership may be transferred to another member of the organization/business at no cost.

Who Chooses the Proposed Designees?

Once an organization/business becomes a Corporate Member, it will appoint a primary member and up to two individuals to be its designees. Ideally one should be a senior executive of the organization and others to be named.

What Process is Used by the Salina Rotary Club to Approve These Individuals?

The organization/business will be the Corporate Member of the Salina Rotary Club and as such has the right to decide who its designees are. The Salina Rotary Club Board of Directors will review and give final approval of those individuals whose names are put forward by the Corporate Partner. The Chair of the Membership Committee will discuss this process with the organization/business.

How Does the Corporate Member Go About Changing Designees?

A Corporate Member may change a designee when it wants to do so and is asked to notify the Salina Rotary Club Board of Directors.

Are Corporate Members Inducted Into the Club?

A Corporate Member will be formally inducted into the club consistent with the traditions of the Salina Rotary Club in relation to new members.

What are the Attendance Requirements of a Corporate Member?

The designees will be expected to represent the Corporate Member on a regular basis, similar to a non-corporate member. If a Corporate Member is unable to attend, their designee will attend in their place.

What Are the Fees for a Corporate Member?

Corporate Members will pay local club and Rotary International dues along with the meal plan. Designees are welcome to attend meetings and meal costs will be billed on a per visit basis, unless they are attending on behalf of the primary member.
